



# Proclamation

Lyn Kilby Zukerkorn moved to Honolulu in 1956 and emerged as a “quiet, but effective” volunteer in the community while raising her children, Sara and Jay.

Her dedication and commitment to her children is seen in the time she spent as a room mother, Girl Scout leader, chair and co-chair for the Punahou Carnival committees.

Over the years, Lyn’s passion remains educating youth through theatre. She has performed every job possible for the Honolulu Theatre for Youth (HTY), from working on stage crews to serving as president of the Women’s Association and serving as a longtime board member. One of HTY’s most successful fundraisers honored Lyn for her years of dedicated service.

Today, more than 50 years later, Lyn continues to serve community causes with dignity and grace. She has been very successful as a board member for Mothers Against Drunk Drivers, chair of the Outdoor Circle Committee, board member for Samaritan Counseling of Hawai‘i, chair of concert reviews for The Honolulu Symphony and as co-chair of the Sisterhood Ethnic Lunch Series, among many other causes.

With her strong commitment to her faith as a foundation, Lyn actively volunteers in the Jewish community as a board member and program chair for Temple Emanu-El. Lyn later joined the staff, spending 11 years as program director, where she was a founder of the Kirk Cashmere Jewish Film Festival. Her passion for the arts allowed her to serve as chair of Temple Emanu-El’s Bimah Furniture Committee, creating biblical designs in needlepoint on cushions for six chairs handmade by another temple member. She also initiated a chamber music series at the temple, “*Music in the Sanctuary*,” and arranged theatre evenings for the congregation at area performances of “*Fiddler on the Roof*,” and “*The Diary of Anne Frank*.”

When the Jewish Federation of Hawai‘i closed its doors, a strong need for social services remained within the Jewish community. Lyn took on the challenge, establishing Jewish Community Services (JCS), a nonprofit agency to support and enhance the quality of life for Jewish people needing social services. Her tenacious volunteer work allows JCS to continue providing much-needed services to Hawai‘i’s residents.
