



Proclamation

Alpha Delta Kappa, an international honorary society, was founded in 1947 in Kansas City, Missouri, by Agnes Shipman Robertson, Marie Neal, Marion Southall and Hattie Poppino, who saw a need to recognize and support the professional efforts of outstanding women educators.

In 1959, Gladys Leiser established the Hawai'i Chapter of Alpha Delta Kappa, which has grown to consist of more than 600 members participating in 19 chapters across O'ahu, Maui, Kaua'i and the Big Island.

Today, the Hawai'i chapters of Alpha Delta Kappa offer members opportunities for leadership development and networking through workshops, training sessions, conferences and conventions. The sorority also provides annual scholarships to students and funding and volunteer services to several community groups, including the Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer Foundation, the Kōke'e Discovery Center on Kaua'i, Honolulu Theater for Youth, Keiki's Dream on Maui, Kids Voting Hawai'i, the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa's Theatre department and Camp 'Ānuenue.
